Supplemental materials may be submitted after the priority deadline and will be reviewed on a rolling basis.  Supplemental materials include: your official high school transcript or GED/TASC scores, TEAS® exam scores, and official transcripts of prior college coursework (regardless of relevancy to the Nursing program).
JUNE	DEC.	Applicant Waitlist is Ranked	Eligible applicants who were not initially accepted will be ranked based on new coursework and whether the TEAS exam was retaken. Waitlisted students who are not offered admission into the Nursing program must reapply the following semester.

## APPLICANT SELF-EVALUATION FORM

Admission to FLCC's Nursing program is based on a point system. Applicants with the strongest academic credentials will have the greatest chance of admission – the more points you have earned, the better chance you have of being admitted. The average number of points earned by accepted students varies year to year based on the applicant pool.

Complete this worksheet to calculate the number of points you've earned and gain a better understanding of how you might compare to the ideal candidate and the overall applicant pool.

### **STEP 1** CALCULATE YOUR POINTS BASED ON THE TEAS EXAM

Once you have taken the Test of Essential Academic Skills (TEAS) exam, calculate the points earned based on your score. A minimum score of 65% is required for acceptance into the program. Visit flcc.edu/teas to sign up for an exam date.

## **STEP 2** CALCULATE YOUR ADMISSION BONUS POINTS (Chart on reverse)

If you have taken any of the Bonus Point Courses listed below, or if you live in the service area, are a veteran, or have earned a B.S. degree with a final GPA of 2.0 or higher, you qualify for **Admission Bonus Points**.

#### Admission Bonus Point Award Rules

- If you have taken BIO 110 Fundamentals of Human Anatomy & Physiology or AP BIO (Advanced Placement) and BIO 171 Human Anatomy & Physiology I, points will only be awarded for BIO 171.
- If you have passed with a grade of C or better in BIO 171 Anatomy & Physiology I, BIO 172 Anatomy and Physiology II, HCS 153 Fundamentals of Health Care, or HCS 154 Medical Terminology and you repeat the course and earn a B- or better on the second attempt, the full point value will be awarded.
- If you have one unsatisfactory completion of BIO 171 Anatomy & Physiology I, BIO 172 Anatomy and Physiology II, HCS 153 Fundamentals of Health Care, or HCS 154 Medical Terminology (i.e. C- or below, I, NA, or W), and you repeat the course and earn a B- or better on the second attempt, half of the point value will be awarded.
- If you have two unsuccessful completions of BIO 171 Anatomy & Physiology I, BIO 172 Anatomy and Physiology II, HCS 153 Fundamentals of Health Care, or HCS 154 Medical Terminology (i.e. C- or below, I, NA, or W), and you successfully repeat the course and earn a B- or better on the third attempt, you will earn zero points for the repeated course.
- If you passed the Aspiring Nurses Roundtable and then later took HCS 153 Fundamentals of Health Care, the grade in HCS 153 will be the grade to which the point rules will apply.
- Any grade of MW (Medical Withdrawal) received from FLCC or any other accredited institution of higher learning awarded before Aug. 31, 2015, will be grandfathered in and will not count against a student applying for the Nursing program. After Aug. 31, 2015, the first MW received for a course will have no impact on the application process; however, any subsequent MWs for the same course will be treated as Ws in the application process. Multiple MWs in more than one semester will require an administrative review for approval.
