Procedures:

- 1. Matriculated students returning after six consecutive terms, or more, should submit a request for Academic Forgiveness to the Academic Exceptions Committee through the website application.
- 2. The Academic Exceptions Committee will determine if that academic forgiveness is in the best interest of the student.
- 3. Once a determination has been made related to forgiveness status, the student will be notified of the outcome. The Registrar will coordinate adjustment to the transcript if appropriate.
- 4. Only one academic forgiveness period will be awarded to any student.
- 5. Academic Forgiveness should not be used for the purposes of scholarship, maintaining GPA or admissions purposes.
- 6. In rare cases, the Academic Exceptions Committee may determine a matriculated student's request can be made before six consecutive academic terms have elapsed.
