Outline of Topics Covered

Melody

- Dictation: stepwise melodies; melodies using Major and minor 2nds & 3rds
- Mode Identification: Major and 3 forms of the minor scale
- Scale Degree ID: single notes
- Intervals: Identify and sing Major and minor 2nds & 3rds; Perfect 4ths and 5ths

Harmony

- Chord Function ID: I, IV and V
- Triad Position ID: all 3 positions of Major and minor triads
- Chord Quality ID: Major, Minor, Diminished, and Augmented triads

Rhythm

Introductory level simple and compound meter

Sight Singing

Perform exercises involving stepwise motion and small leaps
